# **Arrival & Security Information**

- When checking in for your flight, you may be asked some security questions. Simply state that you are on a tour of the Holy Land. They might ask where you are staying. Give them the names of the hotels on the itinerary. Remember they are only concerned about terrorists.
- Upon arrival in Israel, you will go through customs, where they may ask for your purpose of travel. You can explain that you are on a tour of the Holy Land.
- After collecting your baggage, proceed to the arrivals terminal, turn left toward the official taxi line, and follow the transportation instructions below.

# Instructions to Get from the Airport to the Hotel

## Private Taxi (Gett App)

- Download the Gett app (taxi cab) before arrival.
- Follow signs for the official taxi line in the arrivals hall.
- Enter Herods Tel Aviv as your destination in the app.
- The app will generate a code—show this to the taxi attendant.
- The ride takes under an hour and costs ₪180-₪200 (approximately \$50 via credit card).
- Important: Only use white Gett taxis—avoid taxi solicitors.

# What to Bring: Your Essential Packing Checklist

#### **Important Documents**

- Passport—must be valid for at least six months beyond June 16, 2025, with two blank pages
- ETA Visa Confirmation—required for entry into Israel (Apply here, approximately \$10)
- Travel insurance (optional but recommended)
- Flight itinerary and printed copies of important documents
- List of important prescription medications approved by your doctor
- No need to get shekels in advance; you can withdraw from an ATM in Israel or exchange cash if needed
- Credit Card—Notify your bank of your travel plans to avoid any issues.
- Phone—ensure you have an international plan.

## **Clothing & Personal Items**

- Comfortable walking shoes (you will be walking a lot!)
- Closed/attached sandals and flip-flops
- Modest clothing for religious sites (shoulders and knees covered)
- Lightweight, breathable layers (Israel is warm in June, but evenings can be cool)
- Dressier outfit for the dedication ceremony
- Sweater or light jacket (for cooler nights and air-conditioned venues)
- Swimwear (optional for hotel pools or the Dead Sea)
- Hat and sunglasses for sun protection
- Bible, journal, and pen

- Reusable water bottle (stay hydrated!)
- Small backpack or day bag
- Toiletries & prescription medications (in original packaging)
- Sunscreen (SPF 30+)
- Small towel
- Travel adapter (Israel uses Type H outlets, 230V)
- Battery pack for phone charging on the go
- Neck pillow, earplugs, and sleep mask (for flights and shared rooms)
- Small first aid kit (band-aids, pain relievers, motion sickness tablets, etc.)

# **Recommended Gratuities**

It is customary to provide tips to the guide, driver, hotel, and restaurant staff. Tips are typically given in US dollars or shekels. Please note this was not included in your tour cost.

The recommended amounts are:

- guide: \$6-8 per participant per day

# Solitude Time: A Devotional Guide for the Trip

"This book of the law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it; for then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have success." (Joshua 1:8)

## S: Scripture

Open your Bible to your daily reading and take time to read thoughtfully, allowing God to speak to you. As you read, pay attention to a verse that stands out or resonates deeply. When you find it, write it down in your journal.

# **O: Observation**

What is God revealing to you through this Scripture? Take time to reflect on its meaning and context. Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and reveal Yeshua to you in a deeper way.

# A: Application

Reflect on how this Scripture applies to you personally. Does it strengthen, encourage, or challenge you? Consider what God is revealing to you through this passage and write down how you can put it into practice today.

## P: Prayer

Close in prayer, asking God to guide you in applying this Scripture properly. Remember, prayer is a two-way conversation, so take time to listen to what God wants to say to you. Write down your prayer.

# Day 1: A Journey of Faith Begins

## Scripture: Hebrews 12:2; Isaiah 55; Psalm 121

**Observation:** As you embark on this journey to the Holy Land, take a moment to be still and lift your eyes to Jesus. Remember, this is not just a trip—it is a pilgrimage of faith where God

desires to reveal more of Himself to you. The excitement and anticipation you feel are the beginning of a spiritual journey that will deepen your understanding of God's Word and His heart for His people. Trust that He will show you new depths of His love, truth, and purpose throughout this trip.

As you depart, know that you are stepping into a story much bigger than your own—one that spans thousands of years and holds the promise of joy and peace. God has called you to this moment for a reason, and He will guide you every step of the way.

**Application:** Take a few moments to sit in stillness as you begin this journey and ask God how He wants to speak to you during this time. What is He preparing your heart for? How might He use you as His hands and feet to bless His people while in the land?

Remember, this is not just another experience; you are stepping onto holy ground where God's plan for salvation unfolded. How can you approach this pilgrimage with a heart of gratitude and anticipation, expecting God to reveal more of Himself and His purposes to you?

**Prayer:** Lord, as I depart today for Israel, I step out in faith, trusting that You will guide every step of this journey. Thank You for the opportunity to walk where You walked and to see the land that holds so much of Your redemptive history. I pray for open eyes to see Your purposes and a heart ready to receive all that You have for me. May this trip deepen my faith, strengthen my love for Your people, and grow my understanding of Your eternal plan. Amen.

## Day 2: Embracing God's Covenant and Blessing

## Scripture: Genesis 12:1–3, Psalm 105

**Observation:** In Genesis 12:2–3, God made a covenant with Abram (later renamed Abraham), which included making him a great nation, giving him a land, and granting his descendants a holy purpose. The Jewish people were also to be a bridge of blessing to the world. The Abrahamic covenant not only established the unique role of Israel in the world but also forged an extraordinary relationship between Israel and the nations. There were mutual obligations for both Jewish and Gentile people toward one another embedded in the covenant from the very start. God promised to bless all the families of the earth through the Jewish people, and in return, Gentiles were to bless Israel (Genesis 12:3).

**Application:** As you embark on this journey through Israel, reflect on how God's covenant with His chosen people and the land of Israel still stands today. Consider your role as a believer in the Jewish Messiah and how God may be revealing His purpose for you in the land He promised to Abraham and his descendants. This land is deeply connected to the history of God's covenants, and as you walk through the Promised Land, ask God to open your eyes to His heart for Israel and His plan for the nations. Whether through helping those in need, standing with Israel, or reflecting His love, we are called to be a blessing in the places we go. God invites you to understand His covenant in a deeper way as you experience the land and

people He has set apart.

**Prayer:** Lord, as I begin this journey through the land of Israel, I thank You for the covenant You made with the Jewish people and for the pivotal role You have for them in Your divine plan. Open my heart to a deeper understanding of Your promises to Israel and Your love for all nations. May this trip be a time of revelation, where I gain a new perspective on Your covenant and how, as a follower of the Jewish Messiah, I am called to stand with Israel and bless others. Help me to see Your purpose in this land and teach me to reflect Your love and faithfulness in all that I do. May my actions, words, and heart be fully aligned with Your will. Amen.

## Day 3: Come Follow Me

## Scripture: Matthew 4:12–25; Isaiah 6:8; Psalm 27

**Observation:** Today, as we stand in the very places where Jesus called His first disciples, we are reminded that His invitation was simple yet life-changing: "Follow Me." These fishermen were ordinary men, busy with their daily work, when Jesus stepped into their lives and gave them a new purpose. He called them not just to believe in Him but also to leave everything behind and walk with Him.

The Galilee region was the epicenter of Jesus' early ministry. Here, He preached, healed the sick, calmed storms, and performed miracles that revealed His power and love. From Capernaum to the Mount of Beatitudes, Jesus' words and works transformed lives. His ministry began here, and it was from this very place that the gospel would eventually go out to the whole world.

**Application:** Just as Jesus called Peter, Andrew, James, and John, He calls each of us today. He meets us in the middle of our daily routines, our careers, our struggles, and says, "Follow Me." This is not just a call to faith but a call to action. What is Jesus calling you to leave behind in order to follow Him more fully? Are there distractions, fears, or doubts that hold you back from saying "yes" to His plans?

As we stand by the Sea of Galilee today, let's ask ourselves: Am I truly following Jesus, or am I holding on to my own plans? How can I be a "fisher of men" in my own community, workplace, or family? What step of faith is God asking me to take right now? How can I bless my Jewish friends with support, prayer, and the gospel message?

Jesus does not call the qualified—He qualifies the called. Just as He used simple fishermen to change the world, He can use you. The question is: Will you follow?

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, thank You for calling me to follow You. Just as You called Your disciples by the Sea of Galilee, I know You are calling me to a deeper walk with You. Give me the courage to leave behind anything that keeps me from saying "yes" to Your will. Help me to trust You

fully, step out in faith, and be a light to those around me. Use me for Your Kingdom, Lord. In Jesus' name, Amen.

## Day 4: Finding Strength in God's Protection

#### Scripture: Isaiah 40:31; Psalm 63

**Observation:** As you visit the Dead Sea and Ein Gedi, you walk through places that have served as refuges and sources of strength and renewal throughout history. In Psalm 63, written by David while he was hiding in the wilderness of Judah (likely near Ein Gedi), he expresses a deep longing for God's presence and a recognition of God's sustaining power. Despite his difficult circumstances, David acknowledged that God is his refuge and source of strength. The Dead Sea, with its healing waters, filled with minerals and salts, reminds us of God's ability to restore and renew us, even when we feel like we are at our lowest point. These sites reflect the spiritual truth that God is our refuge, strength, and helper in the wilderness of life.

**Application:** As you visit these iconic places today, take time to reflect on how God has been your refuge and strength. In what ways has He provided for you in moments of need? Just as David found solace in God's presence, trust that God will continue to be your refuge, providing you with strength for the journey ahead.

**Prayer:** Lord, just as David cried out to You in the wilderness of Ein Gedi, I seek Your presence today. You are my refuge and my strength, and I trust in Your ability to protect and renew me. Help me to find peace and rest in Your loving care. Amen.

## Day 5: Bearing Witness and Mourning with Those Who Mourn

#### Scripture: Romans 12:15; Isaiah 40; Revelation 21:1-5

**Observation:** Today will be a solemn and heavy day as we bear witness to the tragic events of October 7, 2023. We will walk through places where lives were shattered—the Nova Music Festival site, the ruins of Sderot's police station, the car graveyard at Moshav Tekuma, and the bomb shelter in Mefalsim.

We will be guided by Amit Musaei, a survivor of the October 7 attacks and a professional tour guide. As he shares his firsthand account of the horrors endured and the resilience of those who lived through them, our journey will deepen in meaning. Through Amit's story, we will gain a more personal and profound understanding of the suffering and ongoing struggles the people of Israel continue to face.

As believers in Yeshua, we are called to mourn with those who mourn. We do not come with easy answers or shallow comforts, but with hearts open to listen, to grieve, and to stand in solidarity. In the face of such darkness, we must remember that our presence itself is a

testimony of love. We are here because we care. We are here because we stand with God's chosen people. We are here because our Messiah calls us to be a light, even amid sorrow.

**Application:** As we walk through these sites and hear the stories of survivors, let us allow our hearts to be moved. This is not just history—it is the ongoing reality for the people of Israel. Our Jewish brothers and sisters have a saying: *"May their memory be a blessing."* As we remember those who were lost, we can honor their memory by standing with the living—those who survived, those who continue to seek peace, and those who carry the weight of this tragedy. We can also commit to prayer, asking God to bring comfort to the brokenhearted, healing to those still suffering, and justice for the innocent.

Yet, even as we grieve, we do not grieve without hope. We hold fast to the promise that one day, Yeshua will return, and every tear will be wiped away. The pain of this world will not have the final word. Until that day comes, we stand as watchmen—praying for Israel, loving her people, and being tangible expressions of Yeshua's love in a broken world.

**Prayer:** Father, today I come with a heavy heart, grieving for the lives lost and the suffering endured on October 7 and following. You are the God who sees, the God who heals, and the God who remembers. I ask You to comfort the families who lost loved ones, to strengthen the survivors, and to bring peace to this land. Help me be a light today—not with words, but with my presence, my prayers, and my love. May my standing with Israel reflect Your heart for Your people. Lord, may their memory be a blessing, and may You bring beauty from these ashes in ways I cannot yet see. Amen.

#### Day 6: The City of the Great King

#### Scripture: Psalm 122; Isaiah 62

**Observation:** Jerusalem has always been central to God's redemptive plan. It is the city where kings ruled, prophets spoke, and where Yeshua walked, taught, gave His life for us, and rose again. It is also the city where He will one day return as the promised Messiah and reign as King.

As you stand on the Mount of Olives, remember that this is where Jesus wept over Jerusalem and where He will one day return (Zechariah 14:4). The Garden Tomb reminds us of His victory over death, the fulfillment of God's promise of salvation. Walking through the Old City, you will see the layers of history and faith that make this place so significant. Standing on the Southern Steps, where Jewish pilgrims ascended to worship at the Temple, you can imagine Yeshua Himself teaching here. Exploring the City of David, the ancient heart of Jerusalem, reminds us that this has always been the city of the Great King—past, present, and future.

Despite its spiritual significance, Jerusalem has been a place of great turmoil, conflict, and longing for peace. Yet, we are commanded to pray for its peace, knowing that true and lasting peace will only come through the Prince of Peace, Yeshua the Messiah.

**Application:** As you walk through the streets of Jerusalem today, take time to reflect on its history and prophetic future. Pray not only for the peace of this city but also for the people—Jewish, Arab, and all who call it home. Would you ask the Lord to make you a watchman on the walls of this great city, continuing to pray and intercede even after you return home? May your heart remain burdened for Jerusalem, longing for the day when the Prince of Peace will reign here in fullness.

**Prayer:** Lord, I pray for the peace of Jerusalem, the city You love. As You declare in Isaiah 62, may I never be silent in praying for her until her righteousness shines like the dawn. As I visit these places where You walked, taught, and fulfilled Your mission, deepen my faith and my love for Your chosen people. May Your purposes be fulfilled in this city and in my heart. Make me a watchman on her walls, steadfast in prayer and faithful in intercession for Your people. Amen.

## Day 7: Walking the Land of Promise

#### Scripture: 1 Samuel 17:45–47; Luke 24:13–35; Isaiah 40:4–5

**Observation:** Today, we will walk through the rich biblical landscape of the Judean foothills. As we stand in the Valley of Elah, we will recall David's bold faith as he faced Goliath, trusting not in his own strength but in the name of the Lord. Along the road to Emmaus, we will reflect on the risen Messiah revealing Himself to His disciples through Scripture and fellowship. At Sha'ar HaGai, a critical gateway to Jerusalem throughout history, we'll consider the sacrifices made to establish and preserve the modern State of Israel.

This region is filled with stories of faith, victory, and revelation. Each site we visit connects us more deeply to the biblical narrative and reminds us that God's promises are not only historical but enduring. The land itself testifies to His unfolding plan of redemption through His people and His Messiah.

**Application:** Walking in the footsteps of David and the disciples, we are reminded that our faith, like theirs, must be active and courageous. As you reflect on today's journey, ask: Where is God calling me to stand in faith today? How does encountering the land of Scripture deepen my trust in God's Word and His promises? Allow these sacred places to strengthen your understanding of God's character and His covenant with Israel.

**Prayer:** Lord, thank You for the privilege of walking the very ground where Your truth was lived out. May the stones of the Valley of Elah and the path to Emmaus stir my heart to trust You more deeply. As I witness the beauty and history of this land, increase my faith and renew my commitment to Your purposes in Israel and beyond. Amen.

## Day 8: Walking in Biblical History and Celebrating God's Faithfulness

Scripture: Genesis 35:10–12; Jeremiah 31:31–38; 1 Peter 2:4–10

**Observation:** Today, we will encounter both the ancient and living stones of Israel. As we explore the central coast, we'll visit Caesarea, where the apostle Paul once stood trial and the gospel began to spread to the nations, and Megiddo, an important archaeological site rich with biblical and prophetic significance. These ancient places help us trace the story of God's hand in history, reminding us of His sovereignty, promises, and redemptive plan for the world.

In the late afternoon, we will transition from exploring history to celebrating the present as we attend the Dedication Ceremony for Chosen People Ministries' new ministry center in Tel Aviv. This moment marks a powerful step forward in our mission to bring the hope of the Messiah to the Jewish people. Together, we will thank the Lord for His provision, pray over the ministry ahead, and dedicate this space for His glory and purposes.

**Application:** As we stand among ancient ruins and then witness a new chapter of ministry unfolding, we are reminded that God is always building—both in hearts and through His people. Let today challenge you to see how God's work spans generations and continues through ministries like Chosen People Ministries. Ask yourself: What is my role in this ongoing story? How can I be part of God's redemptive work in Israel and beyond?

**Prayer:** Lord, thank You for the opportunity to walk through sites where Your Word came alive in history. And thank You for the privilege of witnessing Your Spirit moving in modern Israel. As we dedicate this new ministry center to You, may it be a beacon of light and truth. Help me see how You are calling me to stand with and serve Your people today. Amen.

#### Day 9: Send Me!

## Scripture: Romans 15:13; Isaiah 6:8; Acts 1:8

**Observation:** Today marks the end of our trip, and as we prepare to return home, let us pause and reflect on all we have experienced and learned during our time in Israel. From walking the ancient streets of Jerusalem to bearing witness to the resilience of the Jewish people, we have witnessed God's faithfulness in action. This journey has not only been about exploring a land but also deepening our connection to God's heart for His chosen people and Israel.

As we leave, we are reminded of God's promise that He is the God of hope, joy, and peace. No matter where we go, we carry the light of His love and the hope of the gospel with us. Our hearts are full, not only because of the experiences we have shared but because of the deep connection we now have with Israel and God's chosen people. This is a hope that does not end when we board the plane—it continues with us, and it compels us to share it with others.

In Isaiah 6:8, we hear God's call, asking, "Whom shall I send?" Like Isaiah, we respond with a willing heart: "Here am I. Send me!"

**Application:** Today is not just about goodbyes but about sending forth. As we leave the Holy Land, we are leaving as ambassadors of hope. The joy we have received, the peace we have experienced, and the lessons we have learned are gifts to be shared with those we encounter.

Whether at home, at work, or in our communities, we now have a deeper understanding of God's redemptive plan for Israel and our role in it.

Consider how you can continue to stand with Israel, pray for the peace of Jerusalem, and support God's chosen people. Our journey may have ended, but our calling to love and serve Israel remains. We also carry with us the message of Yeshua—the hope of Israel and the Savior of the world.

Take a moment to reflect on how this trip has impacted you personally and spiritually. How can you be a voice of hope in a world that so desperately needs it? Allow the power of the Holy Spirit to fill you with a renewed sense of joy, peace, and a deep desire to continue loving and serving the Jewish people and Israel.

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for the incredible journey I have had in the Holy Land. Thank You for the privilege of witnessing Your faithfulness and for the opportunity to stand with Your people and with Israel. As I prepare to return home, I ask that You continue to fill my heart with hope, joy, and peace. May the lessons I have learned stay with me and continue to shape my heart and actions.

Fill me with Your Holy Spirit as I go and help me be an ambassador of hope to those around me. I go with a heart full of gratitude and excitement to share what I have learned with my family, friends, and community. I commit to praying for the Jewish people and Israel. Thank You, Lord, for being the God of all hope, and for Your faithfulness to Your covenant people. Amen.

## Day 2: Monday, June 9 – Central Coast and Galilee

After breakfast, check out of the hotel and tour Old Jaffa, then travel north to the Sea of Galilee region.

#### **Overnight**: Lower Galilee – David's Harp Hotel
